Unwanted/Orphan Sources

- Trilateral Initiative between the U.S. NRC, Mexico, and Canada.
- Department of Energy's Offsite Source Recovery Program.
- Conference of Radiation Control Program Directors' National Orphan Radioactive Material Disposition Program.

Import/Export Part 110 Regulations

- Rule conforms NRC's export/import regulations to the Code of Conduct
- Requires specific (instead of general)
 licenses to export or import Code of
 Conduct Category 1 and 2 radionuclides
- Different from the Code, the rule covers bulk material

National Source Tracking System

- Interim Database, begun in 2003 and updated annually, meets the goal of the Code of Conduct for a national registry
- NSTS expands capability to actually track transactions on a web-based system
- Enables tracking of Category 1 and 2 sources from IAEA Code of Conduct, from origin through changes of ownership, to disposition

Control and Security of Radioactive Sources

- NRC is using a risk informed graded approach for enhanced security measures
 - Nuclear power plants to small materials licensees
 - Identified sources that warrant greatest control
 - Coordinated with states, other agencies, licensees
 - Enhanced tracking of radioactive sources
 - Implementing IAEA Code of Conduct
 - Issued advisories for National Special Security Events

Enhanced Security Activities

Orders

- Large Panoramic Irradiators Security Measures
 Order -June 6, 2003
- Manufacturing and Distribution Licensees Security
 Measures Order January 12, 2004
- Transportation of Radioactive Material Quantities of Concern – July 19, 2005
- Increased Controls for other types of materials licensees – November 2005

- Objectives
 - Enhance control of material to prevent unauthorized access for malevolent use of material or mitigate consequences
- Emphasis
 - Prompt enhancements
 - Practical measures

Basis

- Prevent theft/diversion for malevolent use
- Prompt detection, assessment, and reporting
- Prompt Local Law Enforcement Agency (LLEA) response
- Confirmation of shipping/receiving
- Additional security for sources in transit
- Changes in the threat environment may indicate additional needs

- Security Assessments of materials licensees have been performed
 - Irradiator
 - Manufacturing and Distribution
 - Medical facilities
 - Universities
 - Radiographers and Well Loggers
- Increased Controls informed by results of Security Assessments

 Licensees that possess sources greater than the quantities Category 2 (including aggregated quantities)
