# MAJOR INDUSTRY CONCERNS ABOUT DOE PROCUREMENTS

#### THE THREE Ds of DOE

- 1. DELAYS
- 2. DETAILS
- 3. DEBRIEFINGS

Root cause is fear of protest?

### **DELAYS**

- •SOLICITATION TO DRAFT RFP Increased from 5 months up to a year
- •DRAFT RFP TO FINAL RFP Increased from 4 months to 18 months+
- EVALUATION TO AWARD
  Increased from 6 months up to 2 years with discussions and questions

## **DETAILS**

- •INCREASE IN PAGE LIMITATIONS
  From 150 to up to 400 pages
  Detailed sub-factors tied to the SOW
- •LONGER STATEMENTS OF WORK
  From 18 pages to 193 pages
  No priorities on the key work elements

•DETAILED COST REQUIREMENTS
Shift from M&O key costs to detailed
cost estimates tied to WBS for next 5
years on cost-plus contracts with
uncertain funding budgets or sound
base lines

### **DEBRIFINGS**

- SOME IMPROVEMENT

  Better attitude and openness
- •HIGHLY VARIBLE

  Still resistant to answer questions and lack of consistency in what is allowable
- •PERCEPTIONS OF THE SEB Understanding and responsiveness reflects on the caliber of the evaluators
- •LACK OF DETAILS
  Difficult to gain lesson learned on both sides. Encourage bidder views

#### **GOOD NEWS**

- •NO PROTESTS THIS PAST YEAR
- NNSA CHANGED THE PROCESS
- •SC HAS HIGH CONSISTANCY
- •EM HAS RAISED THE PRIORITY
- •DOE IS ACTIVELY WORKING TO IMPROVE THE ACQUISITION SYSTEM
