ICP Mission



- The ICP involves the safe environmental cleanup of the Idaho National Lab site, contaminated with legacy waste generated from World War II-era conventional weapons testing, government-owned-research and defense reactors, spent nuclear fuel reprocessing, laboratory research, and defense missions at other DOE sites.
 - 215 excess EM facilities
 - three reactors
 - management of spent nuclear fuel
 - treatment and disposal of sodium-bearing waste to the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant in New Mexico
 - emptying and disposal of all tank farm facility waste tanks
 - remediation of the Subsurface Disposal Area at the Radioactive Waste Management Complex





The 7-year, \$2.9 billion cleanup project, funded through the DOE's Office of Environmental Management, focuses equally on reducing risks to workers, the public, and the environment and on protecting the Snake River Plain Aquifer, the sole drinking water source for more than 300,000 residents of eastern Idaho.

To reach our 2012 cleanup commitments, CH2M-WG Idaho will treat a million gallons of sodium-bearing waste, remove targeted transuranic waste from the subsurface

The Idaho Cleanup Project contract represents the next generation of Department of Energy contract reform and contains key provisions for increased subcontract competition and safety and performance incentives. At CWI, our delivery philosophy centers on creating a strong team that includes skilled, innovative, and proven subcontractors-large and small.

Over the 7-year life of the project, we expect to procure services such as analytical sampling and analysis, information technology and communications, waste treatment and disposal, decontamination and demolition, training, facility infrastructure, environmental restoration, heavy equipment, and security-and commodities such as health, safety, and office equipment and supplies.
