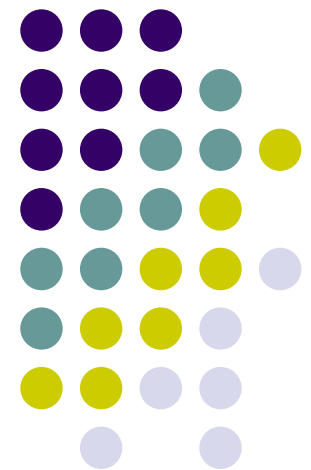


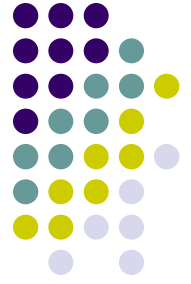

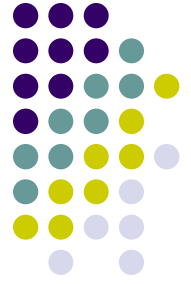

My EFCOG Topic Examples



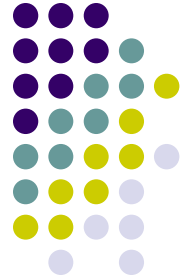
- SBA-NAICS Small Business Standard Size Exception for Engineering in Nuclear Waste Policy Act Applications, \$25M
 - The NAICS Code for Engineering Services is currently set at \$4.5M.
 - Except: Military and Aerospace: \$25M
 - Except: National Energy Policy Act: \$25M
 - Except: Marine Engineering and Naval Architecture: \$17.0M

- Regional Economic Diversification and Sustainable Business Rates
 - Use of GSA Rate Schedules and DCAA Audited Rate Structures in DOE Subcontractor Procurements
- Department of Energy Mentor-Protégé Program
