Approximately 40 people attended this session that provided an update to their fixed based LLW processing facility. Each of the 6 panelists gave a 12 minute overview of their company's facility and services. Each covered their processing/treatment capabilities and technologies that accomplish volume reduction, cost savings and/or solutions to standard and problematic waste forms.

Following all presentations, the floor was opened for questions to individual speakers or to the panelists in general. Approximately 6 individual questions were fielded and a panel discussion ensued following a question about revised processor services to accommodate the forthcoming changes to the NRC 10 CFR 61 BTP on Concentration Averaging

<u>Tammy Monday</u> announced the acquisition of Safety and Ecology Corporation, which now is a wholly owned subsidiary of Perma-Fix Environmental Services, Inc.

<u>Brian Parsons</u> announced that Energy *Solutions* has reintroduced SafeCheck following a revision to the State of Tennessee's requirements which standardized BSFR for all processors.

<u>Bill Smart</u> displayed a sample and discussed their GeoMelt Vitrification Technology that has been approved by the State of Tennessee for Class B/C filters and sealed sources.

<u>Scott Eklar</u> assured the listeners that ALARON was still providing the same services as historically offered.

<u>Steven Jameson</u> discussed Semprasafe services, a joint venture company with Energy *Solutions*, as an economical and environmentally sound solution for the management and treatment of resins for disposal at the Clive or Andrews disposal facilities.

<u>Tom Duberville</u> announced the processing of mechanical filters at Toxco's Oak Ridge facility. The filter processing service consists of shredding mechanical filters, in line

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mixing with concrete and liner containerization such that a homogeneous waste form is generated in accordance with the NRC BTPs and the State of Utah for disposal primarily at the Clive Disposal Facility.

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
