

8 Key Elements in Strategy

- 1. A new consent-based approach to siting future nuclear waste management facilities.**
- 2. A new organization dedicated solely to implementing the waste management program and empowered with the authority and resources to succeed.**
- 3. Access to the funds nuclear utility ratepayers are providing for the purpose of nuclear waste management.**
- 4. Prompt efforts to develop one or more geological disposal facilities.**

8 Key Elements in Strategy (cont.)

- 5. Prompt efforts to develop one or more consolidated storage facilities.**
- 6. Prompt efforts to prepare for the eventual large-scale transport of spent nuclear fuel and high-level waste to consolidated storage and disposal facilities when such facilities become available.**
- 7. Support for continued U.S. innovation in nuclear energy technology and for workforce development.**
- 8. Active U.S. leadership on international efforts to address safety, waste management, non-proliferation, and security concerns.**
