The Team handed Christine Gelles a draft copy of the 2 reports that are in a final review for transmittal to DOE with recommendations for improvement: 1) use of DOT 49 CFR 173 contamination limits vs. use of DOE 10 CFR 835 release limits for the release of trailers used by vendors to ship waste. The inconsistent use of these limits across the complex has caused difficulties for the release of trailers from a DOE site after it was received by the site, and 2) evaluation of suspect counterfeit bolts/tie-down straps used in transportation of nuclear waste.
