Complete the cleanup of the Oak Ridge Reservation to:

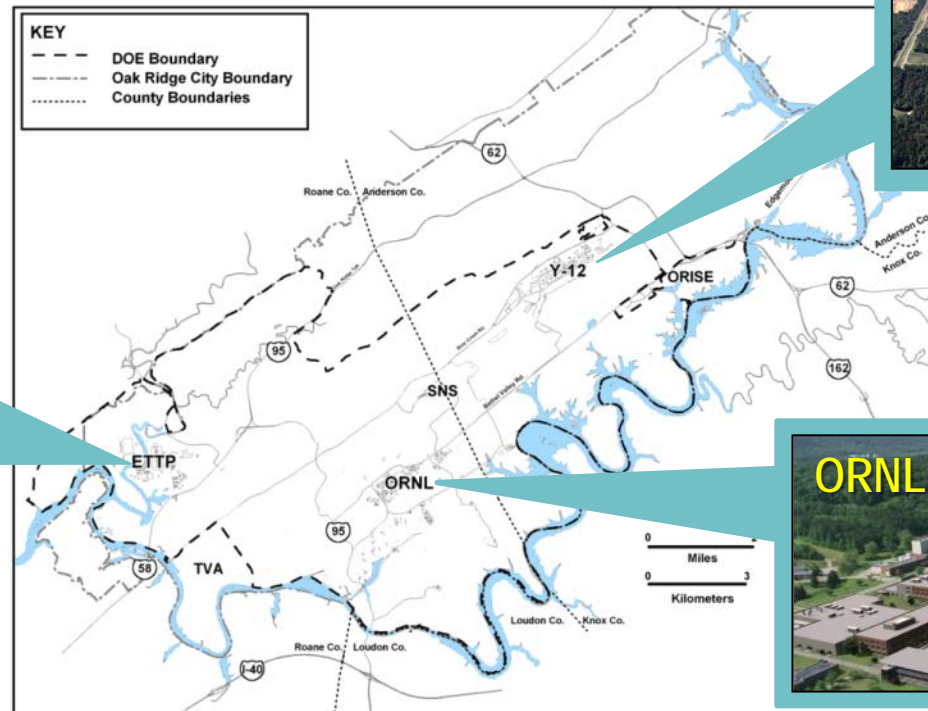
- Protect the region's health and environment

East Tennessee Technology Park

Key Activities

- K-25 building demolition completed in December 2013
- K-27 pre-demolition efforts ongoing
- K-33 building demolition complete
- Fire Water Tower demolition complete



Y-12 National Security Complex

Key Activities

- Conceptual design of Outfall 200 Mercury Treatment Facility nearing completion
- Awarded small business contract for Outfall 200 footprint characterization
- Working through the process to construct a new onsite CERCLA disposal cell
- Recovery Act projects completed



Oak Ridge National Laboratory

Key Activities

- ZPR plate transfers complete and preparations underway for CEUSP shipments (U-233 material)
- Planning additional work in Building 2026 to support U-233 processing campaign
- Central Characterization Project returns to Transuranic Waste Processing Center
- Completing final documentation for Recovery Act project
