It All Comes Down to Risk

Cost Reimbursement


- Government Assumes Most Cost Risk
- Variations
 - Cost Reimbursement with a Fixed Fee/Profit
 - Cost Reimbursement with Incentives
- Requires
 - Robust accounting system to track costs
 - Significant oversight from Government

It All Comes Down to Risk

Fixed Price

- Contractor Assumes Most Cost Risk
- Variations
 - Firm Fixed Price
 - Firm Fixed Price with Economic Price Adjustment
 - Fixed Price with Incentives
 - Fixed Unit Rates

It All Comes Down to Risk



Why Do We Care?

- Need Skin in the Game
 - Pay for Performance
- We've Had Issues
 - GAO High Risk List
- Something Needs to Change
 - President and OMB
 - DOE Deputy Secretary

Factors to Consider

- Complexity of Requirements
- Previous History
- Uncertain Duration of Work
- Contractor's Technical Capability and Financial Responsibility
- Availability of Government Resources

Balancing Act

Cost Reimbursement

- Less incentive to keep performance costs down
- Harder to propose and evaluate
- Need More Resources to Manage
- More flexibility to react to changes

Fixed Price

- Can eliminate overruns
- No detailed cost information required
- Hands-off?
- Defending Contractor Claims
- Inflated price to cover contingencies

Making Fixed Price Work

- Scope Definition (and more Scope Definition)
 - Performance Uncertainties Identified
 - Don't bite off more than you can chew
- Reasonable Prices
 - Estimating Impacts of Uncertainties
 - Contractor Willing to Make an Offer

Making Fixed Price Work

- Shifting the Paradigm
 - Long history of M&O Contracts
 - Large Cost Reimbursement Contracts
 - Preconceived Notions
 - No Skills
- Developing those Skills
 - Defining That Scope
 - Don't Butt In
