## **OPECST**

- Parliament of the consequences of the choice of scientific and technological options, in particular, so as to enable it to make enlightened decisions"
- □ Permanent Joint Select Committee consisting of 18 MPs and 18 senators
- Proportional representation of pol. groups
- □ Scientific council made up of 24 leading figures selected on account of their expertise





## **OPECST**

- ☐ Similar in reach and power of investigation to the United States House Committee on Science, Space and Technology
- A matter can be brought before the OPECST by an internal parliamentary body
- Mandated by law to assess the National Research Strategy, the National Radioactive Waste Management Plan, etc.
- Successive reports and public hearings allow a long term follow up on studied matters





#### Intervention of the Parliament

- December 14, 1990: first report published on behalf of OPECST on High-Level radioactive waste management
- □ December 30, 1991: High-Level Radioactive Waste Management Act (No. 91-1381)
- December 1998: 'A long march towards independence and transparency' (report on behalf of the Prime Minister)
- March 16, 2005: 'Standing the test of time: a bill in 2006 on sustainable management of radioactive wastes' (report)

- ☐ June 13, 2006: Transparency and Security in the Nuclear Sector Act (No. 2006-686)
- ☐ June 28, 2006: Sustainable Management of Radioactive Materials and Wastes Act (No. 2006-739)
- □ September 18, 2014 most recent report on nuclear issues: 'Evaluation of the National Plan for Radioactive Materials and Waste Management, 2013-2015'
- ☐ Since 1990, 30+ reports published by OPECST on nuclear issues
