

- Site Historic Commemoration





Site Transformation

- 1996: Reindustrialization Program begins; Community Reuse Organization established
 - Initial focus was lease of underutilized facilities
 - Site renamed East Tennessee Technology Park
 - Heritage Center established, Brownfield Industrial Park
- 1998: Horizon Center established, Greenfield Industrial Park
- 2003: Program transitioned from leasing to title transfer
- 2005: Black Oak Ridge Conservation Easement established
- 2014: K-25 Historic Preservation Memorandum of Agreement signed

721 acres transferred as of March 2015







Blended End-State

Heritage & Horizon Industrial Parks

21 private companies (Energy, Environmental, and R&D), 200 private industry jobs and 1,114 acres available for industrial use






Conservation and Recreation




- Metropolitan Knoxville
